# Independent auditor's report

## To the shareholders of CC III APCIV K/S

### Opinion

We have audited the financial statements of CC III APCIV K/S for the financial year 01.01.2025 - 31.12.2025, which comprise the income statement, balance sheet, statement of changes in equity and notes, including a summary of significant accounting policies. The financial statements are prepared in accordance with the Danish Financial Statements Act.

### Basis for opinion

Assets are recognised in the balance sheet when it is probable as a result of a prior event that future economic benefits will flow to the Entity, and the value of the asset can be measured reliably.

Liabilities are recognised in the balance sheet when the Entity has a legal or constructive obligation as a result of a prior event, and it is probable that future economic benefits will flow out of the Entity, and the value of the liability can be measured reliably.

On initial recognition, assets and liabilities are measured at cost. Measurement subsequent to initial recognition is effected as described below for each financial statement item.

Anticipated risks and losses that arise before the time of presentation of the annual report and that confirm or invalidate affairs and conditions existing at the balance sheet date are considered at recognition and measurement.

Income is recognised in the income statement when earned, whereas costs are recognised by the amounts attributable to this financial year.

### **Income statement**

#### **Gross profit or loss**

Gross profit or loss comprises other external expenses.

**To what extent were the environmental and/or social characteristics promoted by this financial product met?**

The sole purpose of CC III APCIV K/S is to invest in CataCap III K/S (the "Main Fund" or "CC III") and thereby indirectly participate in any investment made by CC III in underlying portfolio companies. Accordingly, this periodic disclosure reflects the investments made by CC III as the main fund.

CataCap Management A/S (the "Manager") promoted social and environmental characteristics for CC III (and indirectly CC III APCIV K/S) as described in the Manager's Responsible Investment Policy (the "RIP") and

ESG Framework (the "Framework"), including the Manager's minimum requirements:

- i. managing material ESG issues;
- ii. reducing GHG emissions;
- iii. diversity;
- iv. organizational development;
- v. UN Global Compact; and
- vi. codes of conduct.

A detailed description of the criteria for meeting the listed environmental and social characteristics is available in the product website disclosure CC III on the Manager's website.

During the reporting year 2025, the environmental and/or social characteristics promoted by CC III APCIV K/S and the Main Fund were met by application of the Framework, including implementation of the minimum requirements.

Two new investments were made in 2025, including e-Boks Group A/S ("e-Boks") and Thranekær Rådgivende Ingeniører A/S ("Thranekær"). Additionally, the Fund held investments in the following companies: The Army Painter ApS ("The Army Painter") and Enwerdi A/S ("Enwerdi" – formerly "NLM Vantinge").

In the reporting year, all companies worked actively with the Manager's ESG minimum requirements. The Army Painter achieved compliance with 5/6 minimum requirements (due to a change in the Board of Directors reducing gender diversity in the Board to 0%), whereas Enwerdi complied with 4/6 requirements. A project is currently ongoing to ensure full compliance with all requirements in Enwerdi during 2026 as part of a larger ESG strategy project. The two new investments, e-Boks and Thranekær, are still in the 12-month implementation period, and are currently working on implementing the minimum requirements. E-boks, given its maturity at acquisition, already complied with 6/6 requirements as of Q4 2025, whereas Thranekær has initiated preparations for the implementation of the requirements during 2026.

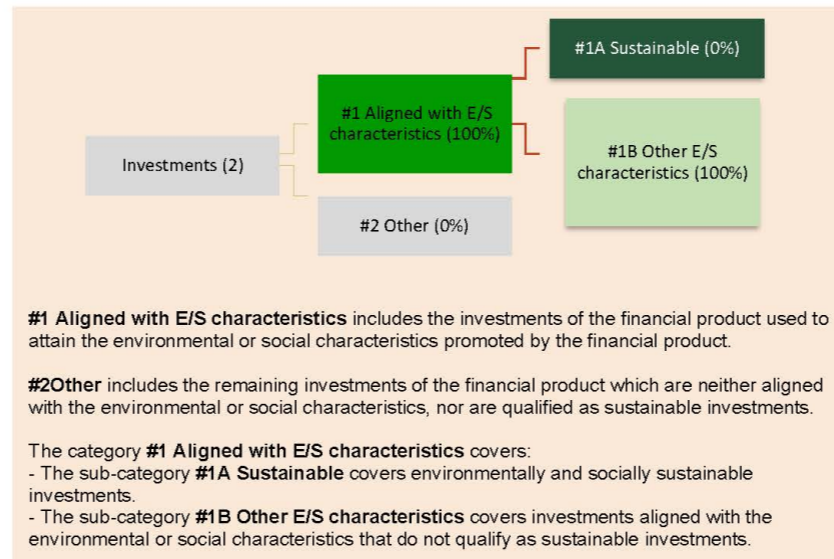

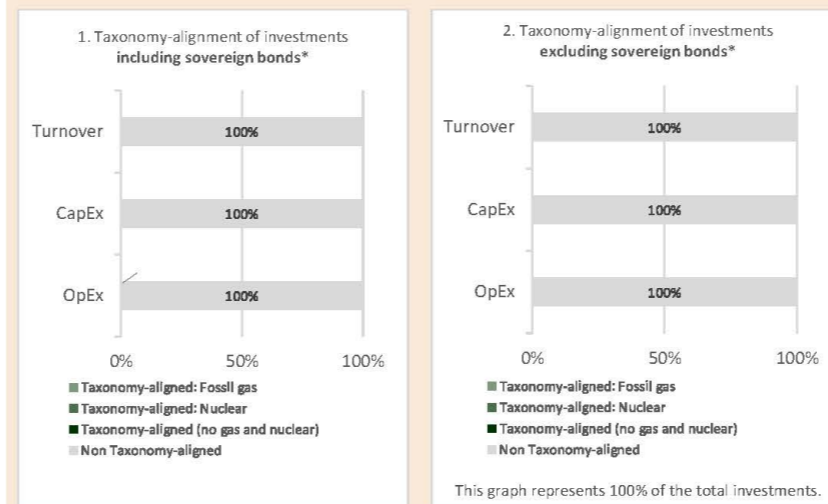

**What actions have been taken to meet the environmental and/or social characteristics during the reference period**

During the reporting period, the Manager has worked together with the portfolio companies to ensure implementation of the Manager’s six minimum requirements.

The Manager held ESG-focused meetings with the portfolio companies in the Fund to follow up on ongoing initiatives, identify potential opportunities to lift and support the companies’ current ESG-related engagements, and plan for support on company-specific and cross-cutting challenges. The conclusions from these meetings are expected to inform planning of ESG-related projects during the coming reporting period.

Additionally, the Manager undertook a smaller revision of the ESG Framework and associated reporting requirements towards the portfolio companies with the purpose of further enhancing the ESG data and reporting maturity of the portfolio in line with investor expectations and reporting frameworks, including the VSME.

The companies in the fund worked with implementing the requirements. A project, which will contribute to Enwerdi's adherence to "managing material ESG issues" was initiated in collaboration with an external advisor, and is expected to be concluded in 2026.

Companies acquired during the period were introduced to the Manager's ESG minimum requirements and ESG Framework, and the work to implement the requirements and apply the Framework will continue into 2026.

Additionally, collection of data for the semi-annual reporting of ESG KPIs covering both environmental and/or social characteristics was conducted and is considered an important action to ensure the companies meet the characteristics.

Various interactions and a strong governance structure (such as board representation including the Vice Chair, Chairmanship meetings etc.) ensure that the actions taken are effective.
