Independent auditor's report

To the shareholders of Heartcore Capital Web3 Fund I K/S

Opinion

We have audited the financial statements of Heartcore Capital Web3 Fund I K/S for the financial year 01.01.2025 - 31.12.2025, which comprise the income statement, balance sheet, statement of changes in equity and notes, including a summary of significant accounting policies. The financial statements are prepared in accordance with the Danish Financial Statements Act.

In our opinion, the financial statements give a true and fair view of the Entity's financial position at 31.12.2025 and of the results of its operations for the financial year 01.01.2025 - 31.12.2025 in accordance with the Danish Financial Statements Act.

Basis for opinion

We conducted our audit in accordance with International Standards on Auditing (ISAs) and additional requirements applicable in Denmark. Our responsibilities under those standards and requirements are further described in the "Auditor's responsibilities for the audit of the financial statements" section of this auditor's report. We are independent of the Entity in accordance with the International Ethics Standards Board for Accountants' International Code of Ethics for Professional Accountants (IESBA Code) and the additional ethical requirements applicable in Denmark, and we have fulfilled our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with these requirements and the IESBA Code. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion.

Management's responsibilities for the financial statements

Management is responsible for the preparation of financial statements that give a true and fair view in accordance with the Danish Financial Statements Act, and for such internal control as Management determines is necessary to enable the preparation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

In preparing the financial statements, Management is responsible for assessing the Entity's ability to continue as a going concern, for disclosing, as applicable, matters related to going concern, and for using the going concern basis of accounting in preparing the financial statements unless Management either intends to liquidate the Entity or to cease operations, or has no realistic alternative but to do so.

Auditor's responsibilities for the audit of the financial statements

Primary activities

The primary activities for the Fund is owning shares in Heartcore Capital Web3 Fund I Holding Limited that are monitoring, developing, and realizing investments in digital assets, including fungible tokens, non-fungible tokens and simple agreements for future tokens as well as equity and equity related instruments such as simple agreements for future equity, issued by companies, foundations and protocols.

Development in activities and finances

The Income statement for 2025 shows a loss of EUR 12,161 thousand and at December 31 2025, the balance sheet of the company shows equity of EUR 18,052 .

Periodic disclosure for Article 6 financial product

The investment underlying this financial product do not take into account the EU criteria for environmentally sustainable economic activities.

The total committed capital to the fund is EUR 24,433,827 divided into 24,433,827 limited partnership shares, of which 21,060,364 are class A shares and 136,183 are class B shares. Class B shares are voteless. Class B shares have certain preference rights in case of distribution of proceeds and liquidation as set out in the limited partnership agreement.

There are no remaining outstanding commitments.

Notes

1 Other external expenses

Other external expenses cover cost for investments that did not materialize, regulatory costs, cost for the fund's advisory and investment board and fees to other advisors.

2 Other operating expenses

The Fund had no employees during the financial year.

Administrative expenses cover management fee to Heartcore Capital A/S of EUR 397 thousand and management fee to General Partner of EUR 6 thousand.

According to Article 107 of the AIFMD Level 2 Regulation and paragraph 61 section 3 (5 and 6) of the Alternative Investment Fund Managers etc. Act, alternative investment funds must disclose information about the total remuneration of the entire staff of the Fund Manager and the number of beneficiaries. Furthermore, remuneration to material risk-takers must be disclosed.

The Fund Manager must also disclose the information necessary to provide an understanding of the risk profile of the Fund and the measures that the Fund Manager takes to avoid or manage conflicts of interest between the Fund Manager and the Limited Partners. The Board of Directors has adopted a remuneration policy in order to ensure that the employees and Management are remunerated according to the Danish Executive Order on remuneration policy and disclosure requirements on remuneration for managers of alternative investment funds, etc.

The remuneration policy ensures, among other matters, that the following is applied in relation to remuneration at the Fund Manager:

- Promoting of sound and effective risk management, which does not encourage excessive risk-taking.

- Consistency with the principles regarding the protection of the Limited Partners and measures in order to avoid conflicts of interest.

In accordance with paragraph 61 section 3 (5 and 6) of the Alternative Investment Fund Managers etc. Act, information regarding salaries paid to employees of the fund manager is disclosed in the Annual Report for Heartcore Capital A/S (CVR no. 33858663).

No carried interest was paid out by the Fund during the financial period.

The subsidiary has investments in listed cryptocurrencies as well as unlisted investments in portfolio companies.

When measuring the equity value of the subsidiary, the measurement is based on the fair value of the assets and liabilities included in the underlying entity, as stated in the audited annual reports. The fair value in the subsidiary is determined using recognized valuation methods, including the International Private Equity and Venture Capital (IPEV) valuation guidelines, which are substantially consistent with the recognition and measurement principles in IFRS 13.

A significant portion of the subsidiary's assets consists of listed cryptocurrencies, where the fair value is determined based on the quoted market price on a recognised cryptocurrency exchange as of 31 December

2025. These prices reflect market conditions at the measurement date but are subject to significant volatility both before and after the measurement date.

Since the valuation in the subsidiary relies on assumptions about, among other things, future earnings in underlying companies owned by the subsidiary and the development of market multiples, the valuation is inherently uncertain. This uncertainty will naturally be greater during periods of volatility in the financial markets, where market multiples and, therefore, the valuation will be influenced by factors such as the development of illiquidity premiums and the ability to sell underlying companies in the subsidiary,

Accounting policies

Basis for financial statements

This annual report has been presented in accordance with the provisions of the Danish Financial Statements Act governing reporting class B enterprises with addition of a few provisions for reporting class C.

The accounting policies applied to these financial statements are consistent with those applied last year.

Consolidated financial statements

Referring to section 110 of the Danish Financial Statements Act, no consolidated financial statements have been prepared.

Recognition and measurement

Assets are recognised in the balance sheet when it is probable as a result of a prior event that future economic benefits will flow to the Entity, and the value of the asset can be measured reliably.

Liabilities are recognised in the balance sheet when the Entity has a legal or constructive obligation as a result of a prior event, and it is probable that future economic benefits will flow out of the Entity, and the value of the liability can be measured reliably.

On initial recognition, assets and liabilities are measured at cost. Measurement subsequent to initial recognition is effected as described below for each financial statement item.

Anticipated risks and losses that arise before the time of presentation of the annual report and that confirm or invalidate affairs and conditions existing at the balance sheet date are considered at recognition and

measurement.

Income is recognised in the income statement when earned, whereas costs are recognised by the amounts attributable to this financial year.

Other external expenses

Other external expenses include include general administration costs.

Other operating expenses

Other operating expenses comprise management fee to the management company, Heartcore Capital A/S.

Income from investments in group enterprises

Income from investments from group enterprises consist the pro rata share of the individual group enterprises profit/loss.

Other financial income

Other financial expenses comprise interest expenses and currency losses, which are not related to value adjustments of investments in portfolio companies.

Balance sheet

Investments in group enterprises

Investments in group enterprises are recognised and measured according to the equity method. This means that investments are measured at the pro rata share of the enterprises' equity value. Reference is made to note 3.

Upon distribution of profit or loss, net revaluation of investments in group enterprises is transferred to the reserve for net revaluation according to the equity method in equity.

Cash

Cash comprises bank deposits.

Other financial liabilities

Other financial liabilities, are measured at amortised cost and comprises other payables.
